City Regulations

Yard/Garage Sales and Signage

Are you planning to have a garage or yard sale this summer? Medford regulates sales as well as sign placement to ensure public safety and prevent retail sales in residential areas.



- You are allowed three garage/yard sales per year, per location
- Sales are limited to household goods and equipment, plants, clothing, furniture, etc.
- Individual sales shall not exceed two days
- The hours of operation shall be limited to 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- Signs or boxes must be placed outside the public right-of-way, which includes sidewalks, curbs, and planting strips
- Signs may not be attached to utility poles, walls, hydrants, bridges or trees in the public right-of-way
- Signs may not be attached or posted on vehicles parked in the public right-of-way or on public property

Yard/garage sales and signage are regulated pursuant to Municipal Code Sections 6.360 and 10.832. Violations are enforced through Medford Code Enforcement Department at (541) 774-2016.

Run for Mayor or City Council Positions

Now is the time to run for Mayor or City Council! Applications to file for candidacy for Medford's Mayor and City Council positions are available in the City Manager's Office, 411 W. 8th Street, Room 310, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

To be eligible for City elective office, a candidate must be a registered voter and must have resided in the City during the six months immediately preceding the election. City Council candidates must also be residents of their ward. The Mayor is elected from the City at large.

At each biennial election, four councilmembers, one from each ward, are elected to serve four-year terms. In this manner, Councilmembers from each ward serve overlapping terms. The Mayor is also elected to serve for a four-year term.

Candidates will be elected through the General Election held November 8, 2016, with terms beginning January 1, 2017. Candidates may run for Mayor or one of the four City wards, but may not run for Mayor and Council concurrently. Ward maps may be found on the City's website under the Maps tab.

To file as a candidate, election forms must be completed and filed with the City Recorder prior to beginning your campaign or gathering signatures. Completed applications are due no later than August 30, 2016. For more information, please contact the City Recorder at (541) 774-2017.

Prescription Drug Drop Box

The first floor of Medford City Hall has a prescription drug drop box for residents to dispose of medications they no longer need.



The following items are accepted:

- Prescriptions, medication samples
- Over-the-counter medications, pet medications
- Vitamins, ointments, lotions
- Liquid medications within a leak-proof container

The following items are **not** accepted:

- Needles/sharps
- Thermometers
- Bloody or infectious waste
- Bulk disposal from businesses, clinics, pharmacies or hospitals
- Hydrogen peroxide
- Aerosol cans, inhalers

The Medford Police Department routinely disposes of the medications in a safe manner. Using this drop box helps eliminate theft and misuse of medications and keeps them out of the City's water and waste treatment systems.
