## **Police Advisory Committee April 19, 2016**

The meeting was called to order at 4:34 p.m. in room #330 of the Medford City Hall.

Roberta Thornton brought the meeting to order.

### **Roll Call:**

### **APPROVAL OF JANUARY 19, 2016 MINUTES:**

After review of the minutes from January 19, 2016, a motion was made to approve the minutes by Chief Sparacino and the motion was seconded by Murray Richmond. All were in favor and the minutes were approved. The minutes from January 19, 2016 were then signed.

### **REVIEW OF CITIZEN COMMENT CARDS:**

Mr. Parsagian enjoyed the letters of commendations, one for a little boy that loves police so much he wears a police costume everywhere; the family friend that wrote a letter after her friend committed suicide thanking the police for their help to the family after this traumatic event; and the "theft of services" letter in which they didn't think there would be police response, but an officer showed up immediately and was very professional.

Ms. Thornton advised that she sent a letter complimenting the officer involved with an evading subject on Hwy 238. Chief Sparacino advised that the letter will be added to the next meeting's information packet. He advised that the officer was Officer Hall. Chief Sparacino mentioned that Officer Hall's nickname is the "Man Tracker" and he has an incredible talent in tracking people.

**INTERNAL AFFAIRS REPORT/QUARTERLY:**

Sgt. Eastman reported on the first quarter of 2016. Fourteen (14) complaints, eight (8) of those complaints were initiated by private citizens. Six (6) complaints were initiated by personnel. Of those eight (8) were sustained, one (1) was non-sustained, four (4) were unfounded and one (1) was exonerated.

Mr. Smith asked if we have a speed limit for officers to drive. DC Johnson advised that we have a no pursuit policy because we want to reduce risk. DC Johnson advised that if we do find out that an officer is going too fast for the circumstances, we bring them in and counsel them.

Mr. Richmond asked if there is a policy regarding social media. Lt. Eastman explained that we do have a policy and all of our policies can be found on our website.

Ms. Thornton asked about the accidental discharge incident. DC Johnson advised that it was a training issue and has been corrected.

Lt. Eastman pointed out a report included in the information packet regarding Policy 402 Racial or Bias-Based Profiling. He discussed the breakdown of statistics. Chief Sparacino advised that we've been tracking race on arrests since 2006. We do not track race on stops and citations finding arrest data to be most accurate.

**COMMENTS AND/OR WRITEN COMMUNICATIONS BY

**Department Updates –  
Personnel:**

Chief Sparacino discussed the recent promotions. Sgt. Eastman was promoted to Lieutenant. Det. Ivens was promoted to Sergeant. Tomorrow

there will be a promotional process for Deputy Chief. With that promotion there will then be another opening for Lieutenant and Sergeant.

Once all openings have been filled we will begin the reorganization of the department. We will be realigning our lieutenant's structure. We will move one lieutenant down from upstairs and move from one (1) lieutenant to two (2) over patrol.

Chief Sparacino talked about the change in the department leadership and culture over the last four months. He reported receiving several positive comments from staff.

DC Johnson announced that we will be starting a Latino Citizen's Academy. It will be yearly and given in Spanish.

Ms. Thornton asked how many would attend and DC Johnson advised there may be 50-60 participants.

Ms. Swift questioned how many patrol positions we are currently down by. Lt. Eastman advised that with the recent hiring of two laterals and another this month we will be down by two (2) positions.

Ms. Thornton discussed the current statistics from the Consolidated Incident Report and noticed that the statistics have gone down.

**Adjourn:**

There being no further business. Meeting was adjourned at 6:12 pm. The next PAC meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at 4:30 pm, in the Medford Room at the Medford City Hall.



Hi Officer Vega,

I was just thinking about events that happened around (2011 & 2012). My name is James Hernandez and I went by Thomas at the time. I thought about when you came to my Mother's Apartment on Taylor St. for what I think was a domestic disturbance call or whatever it was. You recommended that I should leave my home and go to Hearts with a Mission.

You were also there when I got kicked out of hearts with a mission for getting physical with another kid. I had just found out that my mother left me at HWAM and moved to Washington State without informing me. I just broke and I couldn't make sense of it. After I left hearts with a mission and moved to Washington, my mother put me in a teen shelter and eventually abandoned me again and I have not seen her since. After a few weeks of struggling a family took me in and they pretty much adopted me. Getting out of the house was the best thing that could have happened to me at the time. My mother neglected my needs and was verbally abusive and a few times she got physical.

I have stopping drinking and using weed, I graduated high school, and started college at 17 and at the moment I'm pursuing my Associates in Science and I'm almost finished with my first year of college. I have turned everything around and my life is so much better without an abusive parent around.

I don't think you remember me because you probably deal with a lot of Hispanic teens in your community but I just wanted to thank you for telling my mother to send me to HWAM, not arresting me all the times that you could have. I'm so grateful I don't have a criminal record. I am a law abiding young adult and I appreciate all the times that you tried to assist my mother and I with our problems. Thanks sir.

On 06/06/16 at 2224 hours Officer Wileman was dispatched to conduct a ROV and Menacing with a Firearm investigation at 690 Black Oak Drive #7 (Case# 16-13069). At 2246 hours Officer Pickens and other units responded to a drive by shooting that had occurred in the 1400 block of Prune Street (Case# 16-13070). The victim on Black Oak Drive, Emily Torres was reporting that her ex-boyfriend, John Rocha had driven up to her while she was in front of her residence and menaced her with a Mac-10 firearm.

Officer Pickens put out the information describing the suspect vehicle in the shooting on Prune Street. Officer Wileman was able to take that information and connect the suspects in the drive by shooting with Emily Torres. From the information Officer Wileman was gathering on Black Oak Drive he believed that the suspect vehicle in the Prune Street Shooting was most likely a car that belonged to Emily Torres. She did not have any information on her vehicle and was starting to become uncooperative. Officer Pickens heard the names of the people involved and believed this was retaliation related to a case last week where Emily Torres' car had gang graffiti carved into the hood. Officer Pickens located the vehicle info for Torres in his notebook and put it out as a possible suspect vehicle in the shooting. Because of these two Officer's awareness and investigative skill all of the players including the shooting victim who fled the scene were identified very early in the investigation. This also led to JCSO locating the suspect vehicle rolling with the two suspects in it.

There was great team Police work throughout this investigation by Patrol, CID and JCSO. I do not believe we would have had such a quick resolution to this case if it had not been for these two Veteran Officer's having the situational awareness to link this all together and have the information readily available. I commend both Officer Wileman and Officer Pickens for their quality Police work in these cases. You have made this community a safer place.

On the above listed date and time, the Medford Police Department was dispatched to a missing adult male in a motorized scooter that had not been seen for almost 3 hours. This was highly unusual for the individual. Per family members, he is usually gone only 15 to 20 minutes. The individual was 77 years in age, suffered from a traumatic brain injury and required medication on a regular basis for his medical conditions.

Cpl. T. Venables used sound judgement and quick thinking to have over 100 citizens looking for this missing person. Cpl. Venables had the missing entered in to the police data base, sent out a BOLO, notified the Criminal Investigation Division of the case, activated the missing child alert system, posted that case on social media, contacted and received assistance from the Jackson County Search & Rescue team and sent out media releases several times with additional information as it was developed. All of this while still maintaining control of Team 4 as the watch commander. Due to holding calls for service, Cpl. Venables called in several graveyard units early to assist in handling calls.
