10.5.2 - Community Inventory PETE

How is inventory of alternative providers done and how is it updated?

CAPRA Standard:

10.5.2 - Community Inventory

Standard: The agency shall compile a complete and current inventory of parkland and recreation facilities, programs and services in the service area, including those provided by the agency and those offered by schools and other alternative public, private, non-profit providers.

Suggested Evidence of Compliance: Provide a complete and current inventory of parkland, programs and services available in the community, describe the frequency of updates, and describe how the agency makes use of this information.

In Medford, alternative providers of these programs or services could include Medford YMCA, private physical fitness clubs such as Superior Athletic or Anytime Fitness; Kids Unlimited; Easter Seals; Rogue Valley Swim and Tennis Club; Golf Clubs such as Centennial, Eagle Point, Stewart Meadows or Bear Creek; Evergreen Ballroom; HI Yah! Tai Kwon Do; Rogue Scuba; American Red Cross.

Question Response:

We read the area service provider's program guides where they are published, stay in communication with the program managers as possible, and receive public comment about the programs providers.

The City of Ashland and Central Point advertise in our Parks and Recreation program guide and we do the same in their program guides. We advertise numerous classes that the program providers offer in the Program Guide.

An inventory of programs offered by schools and other alternative public, private, non-profit providers is conducted both as an on-going assessment of the area providers and as a part of the periodic updates to the Leisure Service Plan.

We make use of the information gathered by looking for programing needs that may not be met and also at ways to partner with different organizations to expand program offerings to the community.
